



The school most represented is St Andrews (eight students) and continues to have a very strong music program. We are also well represented by Suzuki students, as has often been the case in the past.

Many of the highlights this year have been our concerts:

> Two performances at the Thebarton Community Centre on Sunday 14th March. These concerts were well attended and coming early in the season gave a great morale boost to our students.

> The opening of a performance for the DreamBIG Gala Concert on Saturday 22nd May. It was very well received by the audience and was a great showcase for the AdYO organisation.


> The AdYO "Winter Warmer's" Concert at Norwood Town Hall on 6th June. A shared concert in a new venue for us.

 > Friends of ASO Concert at the ASO's Grainger Studio on 12th September.
It was good to be able to use the 'home' of the ASO for this presentation.

> A Schools Tour on 22nd September visiting Elizabeth Vale PS, Madison Park PS and Ingle Farm PS. At two of these schools, we linked up with beginner string groups there and performed together for the school. This was a wonderful opportunity to encourage string playing and teaching in local schools.

Our repertoire this year was another mixture of old favourites and new material. We have covered nearly twenty pieces ranging from a lovely arrangement of the Finale of Prokofiev's Classical Symphony (which our musicians can play from memory!) to the current Tik Tok favourite "Wellerman" – which happens to be a traditional NZ sea shanty! This year I have included a few regular works such as Rosin Eating Zombies; Guest Soloist; and Final Countdown. They work so well as part of an educational performance. I have arranged a new piece for our large and very capable cello section called "Budapesto". This comes from the AMEB Cello Grade 3 repertoire book, and was chosen because I heard it performed at so many of the cello auditions last year!


This year we had the chance to visit many new concert halls and perform folk music from different cultures and pieces inspired by nature. We especially loved being challenged by music based on the classics like 'Finale from Firebird'. This serious piece taught us how to play with changing time signatures, watch the conductor and project beautiful, soloistic melodies. Contrasting with The Firebird, another highlight of the year was learning 'A Little Suite of Horror' where we had the chance to scream on stage and make silly noises in our mouthpieces.

For many of our members, this is the first time they have regularly rehearsed and performed with an ensemble and they have very quickly recognised the benefits. Every week it's clear that playing music in a band helps them develop musically and emotionally; evidenced through their improved rhythm, blending of tone and sight-reading skills. Our players are also becoming wonderful team players who demonstrate resilience and independence as they rise to the challenge of each new piece.

It's been lovely to see new friendships flourish as our committed members join us each Sunday morning to prepare for their next big performance. Our once shy and nervous group have now played in some of Adelaide most beautiful venues and been featured on a live stream! This modern experience expanded our audience to over 700 people and prepared our young players for their glamorous future performances as they continue their musical journey.

It's been my pleasure to work with the Adelaide Youth Winds in 2021. The enthusiasm and commitment shown by our junior musicians have been so inspiring and I can't wait to work with them again next year.


First of all, I want to state how proud I am of all the young musicians in Adelaide Youth Sinfonia. Many started the year with little or no prior experience with symphonic orchestral music.

Usually our first concert at the end of Term 1 (this year at the beautiful ANZAC Hall at Prince Alfred College) always gives a fair preview of the orchestra's ability and potential. The orchestra performed works by Mussorgsky, Albéniz and Meyer as well as the 1st movement of Symphony No. 8 by Schubert.

Our second concert at Norwood Concert Hall in June had a program with a variety of styles containing works by Grainger, Zimmer and finished with the rhythmically exciting Ritmos Ciganos. During the second half of the year the orchestra prepared the first movement of the highly acclaimed 2nd symphony by Borodin and we had a special performance for parents at our rehearsal studio at the end of Term 3. These informal rehearsal-style performances give parents an insider perspective of our preparation as an orchestra.

Overall, I must say that our young musicians demonstrated an excellent team spirit and work ethic - congratulations to all! At the end of the year many of our young musicians will re-audition and some may move to other groups within the organisation or elsewhere. Regardless of what the future holds, please retain the love of music and be proud of all achievements and remember that music brings an immense joy to all.


If anything attests to the dedication of Adelaide Youth Wind Orchestra's talented players, it's that we've had one of our most successful years of the eight on record, despite ongoing disruptions caused by COVID-19. Those involved in this iteration of the wind band have demonstrated a high level of commitment, enthusiasm and curiosity with respect to the medium and its repertoire. In doing so, they've also become promising future leaders for its advancement here in Australia.

Adelaide Youth Wind Orchestra has covered a wide variety of repertoire in 2021, from a transcription of Bach's 'Prelude and Fugue in B-flat' (BWV 559), to John Paulson's avantgarde victory ode 'Epinicion'. Lovers of wind band will likely recall the classics we performed, including Gustav Holst's 'Second Suite in F', Percy Grainger's 'Children's March' and Edvard Grieg's 'Funeral March for Richard Nordraak'. But far from confined to former centuries, our wind band also tackled contemporary compositions, such as Chen Yi's 'Spring Festival' and Frank Ticheli's 'Nitro' which weren't without their own technical and aesthetic challenges. Be it old or new, foreign or familiar, the students embraced the diversity of this repertoire and what it had to teach them.

This year was also one of collaboration. At the Woodville Town Hall in August, we shared the stage with Woodville High School's Wind Ensemble. Moreover, we opened for the Adelaide Wind Orchestra's concert Apollo Unleashed, featuring Paulson's 'Epinicion' and local composer David John Lang's 'Fanfare for a Warrior', a work Adelaide Youth Orchestra's commissioned in 2018. These events have strengthen the connections across Adelaide's wind band community.

Come November, as our ensemble programs wrap up for another year, some players will be moving on from Adelaide Youth Orchestras, while others will continue on, be it as a member of Adelaide Youth Wind Orchestra or in another ensemble. Whatever their path, I wish them all the best for the musical futures and will cherish the memories of what together we've achieved. My deepest thanks and congratulations.

Often referred to as his greatest opera, this work by Giuseppe Verdi is a great Italian operatic drama combined with religious ritual. Not since the devotional music of the renowned Italian composer Giovanni Palestrina in the 16th century had anything like this been attempted. It is impressive that Verdi, a self-confessed agnostic, could have the necessary deference and understanding to attempt a massive Catholic mass for the dead; a requiem of enormous proportions. Verdi's inspiration for the writing of this work came from the death of Italian poet Alessandro Manzoni ("a great name is lost to the world" Giuseppe Verdi). This immense melodrama combines solemnity and intense religious fervour with pure theatre to produce a work of incredible beauty and passion. Verdi's Requiem is grand opera and the Catholic mass all rolled into one glorious musical spectacle.



SCHOOLS PROGRAM

We were thrilled to finally get back into schools in Term 3, 2021 to continue our program. We were able to visit schools that were unfortunately cancelled last year due to COVID – 19 and schools that we have worked alongside Instrumental Music, as we move forward in increasing engagement in music amongst young primary students across the state. We were fortunate to conduct 15 concerts and three workshops across nine Department schools in Term 3 and continued our work in schools into Term 4.

Special thanks must go to Sharon Burgess - Leader, Learning Pathways (Department for Education – Instrumental Music) and Lisa Bryant – Manager, Music Programs (Department for Education) for their continued support in ensuring that our program works in partnership with the important work that they are doing in schools throughout the state. 


